RULES/ FORMAT / QUOTAS:

Execution according to valid IFSC-Rules and the currently valid Austrian regulations.

Qualification: 2 routes flash

Final: 1 route on-sight | Quota: according to IFSC Rules, dependent on number of starters

SPORT CLASSES AND CLASSIFICATION:

Sport Classes:

The merging of the sport classes will be done according to the international Merging-Rules and will be announced after the classification on Friday, 15 September 2023 via mail to all participants.

In addition to the usual international paraclimbing sport classes, there will also be an Open Class. In this Open Sport Class all the following groups of athletes can participate:

- Athletes without valid international or Austrian classification
- Athletes who have been classified as "NE" or "NE-MIC" = not eligible.

In the Open Sport Class no championship titles will be awarded!















Sport Class Identification:

For non-Austrian athletes:

If a valid* international classification is available, the sport class assigned therein will be applied.

If no valid classification is available, athletes with *physical impairment* will compete in the Open Paraclimbing Class.

Athletes with *visual impairment*, without international classification, need to send their official grading into the sports classes B1/B2/B3 (medical certificate, certificate from other sports etc.) to Austria Climbing right after online registration. The sport class explained therein will be used.

For Austrian athletes:

If a valid* international or national (Austrian) classification is available, the sports class assigned therein will be applied.

Athletes with physical disabilities who are not yet classified will be classified on site. Athletes with *visual impairment,* without international classification, need to send their official grading into the sports classes B1/B2/B3 (medical certificate, certificate from other sports etc.) to Austria Climbing right after online registration. The sport class explained therein will be used.

* A valid classification exists if the sport class has been identified based on the currently valid IFSC rules. So if there was an international start in 2023, this is automatically the case. In all other cases it will be checked individually.

CLASSIFICATION:

As classification only takes place for Austrian athletes, detailed information on that can be found in the German Info Sheet.

ELIGIBILITY:

- Non-Austrian citizens can participate; however, they cannot be awarded championship
- In order to take part in the championships: athletes need to be members of an Austria Climbing member club and need to be Austrian citizens. (membership cards will be checked randomly during registration)
- For underage participants a declaration of consent of the parents or legal guardians must be submitted. The relevant form will be provided on request.
- Each athlete must present a valid **medical confirmation** (max. one year old) that the health condition allows the competition para-sport. If an IFSC license 2023 exists, this is already settled.
- Each athlete agrees to comply fully with the applicable anti-doping regulations.

It is pointed out that incomplete or false information can lead to non-consideration or disqualification of the athlete.

STARTING FEE:

The starting fee is € 20,00 per starter and must be paid in cash during the on-site registration.

REGISTRATION:

Registration is done online, via the Austria Climbing calendar.

Registration deadline: Sunday, 03 September 2023 at 23:59.

Maximum number of starters: 50 athletes (total)

Late entries are not possible!
